Broken, But Made Whole

According to legend, Japanese shogun Ashikaga Yoshimasa sent a cracked chawan - or tea bowl - back to China to undergo repairs. Upon it return, Yoshimasa was displeased to find that it had been mended with unsightly metal This motivated contemporary craftsmen to find an alternative, aesthetically pleasing method of repair. This method became known as Kintsugi.

An entry in Wikipedia describes Kintsugi as the Japanese art of repairing broken pottery by mending the areas of breakage with urushi lacguer dusted or mixed with powdered gold, silver, or platinum.

Through Kintsugi, broken pieces of a ceramic object can be reconnected and remade into a beautiful piece of art.

The art of Kintsugi beautifully depicts what God can do with a broken life.

Our lives are broken by sin, and "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). But God loves us, and He desires to restore us and make something beautiful and eternal of our lives (John 3:16; Romans 6:23).

The process of restoration necessitated the death of God's Son, Jesus, on the cross to pay the price for our redemption from sin (Ephesians 1:7). When we submit the broken pieces of our lives through our trusting obedience, the Potter can restore and remake us into a beautiful object of grace (Ephesians 2:8-10).

God will forgive, restore, and give eternal life those who place their faith and trust in Jesus (Acts 16:30-31), turn from their sins in repentance (Acts 17:30-31), confess Jesus before men (Romans 10:9-10), and are baptized (immersed) into Christ for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38). He will continue to "cleanse and make whole" those who continue to walk in the light of His Word (1 John 1:7-9).

Her original plans were for a short 3-mile hike so she did not take her cell phone with her. She stopped early in the hike to meditate and relax. She laid down on a tree and watched the sky. When she got up, she began to walk back to the car, she thought. But her sense of direction was leading her away from her car. She had no compass and everything in the forest looked alike. During the next confusing days, Amanda tried to find her way out of the forest. She survived by eating berries and plants, and drinking water straight from streams. She lost her shoes in a flood and suffered numerous injuries including a broken leg and an injured knee.

Thanks to the diligence of the search crew, the story has a happy ending.

At a joyful reception for her rescuers, Amanda expressed her thanks to everyone who searched for her. "The community showed up with so much passion. These guys were not going to give up on me. Thank God!" She is also quoted as saying, "There were times of total fear and loss and wanting to give up. It came down to lie and death and I had to choose. I chose life."

Maybe you know someone who is lost spiritually in the jungle of the world. Maybe they have been gone for a long time. They may be so deep in the world that they have no sense of direction and no hope of finding their own way out. Jesus Christ came into the world to seek and save people who are separated from God and are living lost in the world (Luke 19:10). We are His search crew here on earth today. Like the rescuers of Amanda Eller, we must not give up on our efforts to teach them about the salvation found only in Jesus Christ. We must not give up on praying that they will choose life. When Amanda Eller was rescued, there was a great celebration in Maui. When a lost Christian is found, there is an even greater celebration (Luke 15).
